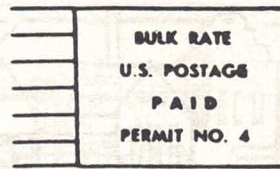

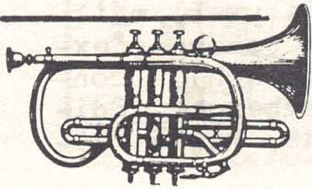

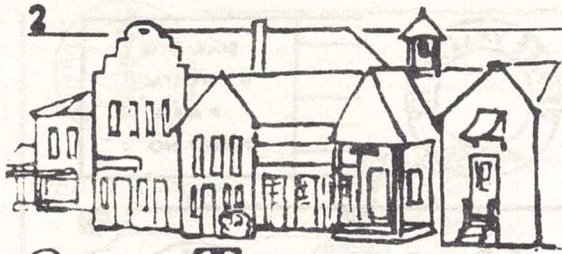

Sign-up deadline for Pewees interested in seeking seats on the City Council is 4 p.m. Aug. 25 at the County Clerk's office in LaGrange.

A petition signed by registered voters in the City is required. Information on the filing procedure may be obtained from County Clerk Martha Davis, 222-9311.

Of the six present Councilmen, five have indicated they plan to seek reelection: Norm Turner, Tom Montgomery, Ralph Beverly, Harry Johns, Charles Dittmeier. The press of other business is keeping John Falvey from running again.

Councilmen are elected for two-year terms.

The Mayor is elected for four years. Incumbent Vivien H. Reinhardt will be halfway through her term at the end of this year.

City Tax Bills Due

The City tax bills went out a little late this year.

If you didn't receive a bill, it would be wise to contact your mortgage company or the former property owner and get the bill from him or her.

Bills must be paid by Aug. 31 to avoid additions to the face amount. Beginning Sept. 1 there is 6% penalty plus 1% per month interest until the bill is paid.

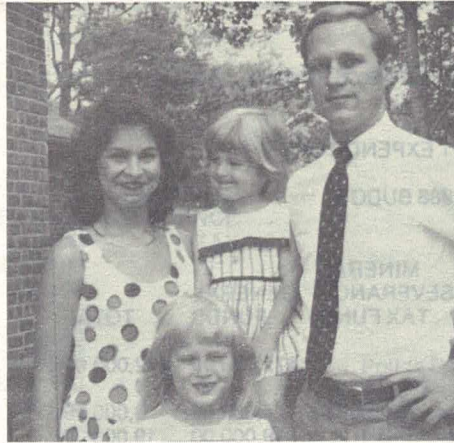

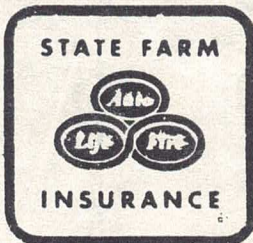
