

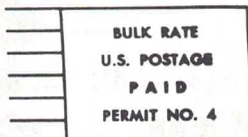

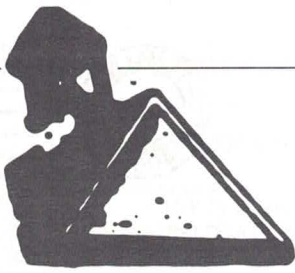

AUGUST COUNCIL MEETING

The eighth regular meeting of the Pewee Valley City Council was held on Monday, August 4, 2003. In attendance were Michael Logsdon, Bob Rogers, Steve Rowland, Suzy Walser, Beach Craigmyle and Kevin Arave. Also in attendance were City Clerk Janette Chapman, Mayor Clayton Stoess, Jr., and City Attorney John Singler.

CITIZENS' CONCERNS

Ed Hayman of 104 Central Court complained of drainage problems there. Mayor Stoess apologized but said that the drainage problems were being investigated. LG&E has removed a tree and this created additional drainage problems.

Barry Ogara, a new resident at the corner of Rebel and Cherry, expressed concern about removal of trees and shrubs from his property without prior notice. The work was apparently done to clear the right of way; Mr. Rogers will investigate.

Discussion was held on tree removal at 120 Tulip and at the corner of Houston Lane and Mt. Mercy Drive.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

*Culvert Fee Reimbursements: The reimbursement request deadline passed on August 5, 2003. Estimated refunds were \$115,000, and about \$80,000 has been refunded to date.

*Mt. Mercy/Houston Abandoned House Status: The Pewee Valley Fire Department burned the house and the lot has been cleared and graded.

*Status of Houses on Central Avenue: Mayor Stoess reported that he had talked to the residents and received a commitment from one to do some remodeling. Progress is being made on the drainage problems; Mayor Stoess is working with the residents and Mr. Rogers is working with the city engineer. A paved ditch is being investigated.

*Master Plan Committee Meeting—Tuesday, August 12th—Town Hall, 7:00 p.m.: Ms. Walser requested that the committee meet at the same time each month. Mr. Craigmyle announced that Marshall Slagel, an authority in planning and zoning in Kentucky, has been asked to meet with this committee.

FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT

Fire Chief Bob Hamilton reported that as of 11:00 a.m. on August 4, 2003, 198 emergency runs had been made; 107 of those were fire runs. This compares to 212 runs in the year of 2002. Fire runs are up. There are 42 volunteers with 24 cross-trained in medic. The average response time dispatched to the scene is five and one-half minutes.

Next year, 2004, will be the 75th anniversary of the Pewee Valley Fire Department, and the Chief would like to commemorate the milestone in conjunction with the annual Summer Festival.

COUNCIL MEMBERS' REPORTS

Kevin Arave—Environmental/Properties

A request for bids for City garbage pickup has been advertised in *The Oldham Era*. Mr. Arave will review responses and report on same at the next Council meeting. Rumpke has not yet submitted a bid.

Beach Craigmyle- Communications

The position for a part-time worker for Town Hall has been advertised in *The Call of the Pewee*. Mr. Craigmyle is reviewing city ordinances to flag those that are antiquated. He continues to work on the city web-site.

Michael Logsdon—Public Safety

Mr. Logsdon reported that the new street signs are in. Mr. Craigmyle moved that the old street signs be declared surplus property and sell for a minimum of \$10 or to the highest bidder; motion passed unanimously.

Bob Rogers—Public Works

Mr. Rogers has talked with Lance Vincent, Oldham County EMS, about putting an ambulance in an empty bay at Town Hall, staffed full time. Mr. Rogers will consult with the City Attorney to draw up an appropriate agreement. The Council voted unanimously to pursue this. Mr. Rogers thanked Stan Fitch for proposing this arrangement.

THE OLDHAM COUNTY ARTS ASSOCIATION is seeking entries for its Sixth Annual Art Show at the Oldham County History Center September 30- October 9, 2003. The show is open to all Kentucky artists age 18 and older. Slides of original two-dimensional work may be submitted for judging by September 1. Cash prizes of over \$500 will be awarded at the reception on September 28. Call Carole Logan at 241-5490 for more information and an entry form.

Steve Rowland—Finance/Legal

An ad soliciting bids for an audit of the financial records has been placed in *The Oldham Era*, with bids due by August 25, 2003. Two people have expressed interest in submitting a bid. The Council will approve a bid at the September Council meeting.

Suzy Walser—Events/Recreation

Ms. Walser proposed October 4, 2003, for the fall clean up date. She reported that she accompanied Town Greeter Maureen Bishop on the past Sunday to visit new residents of Our Town and provided them with literature about Pewee Valley.

Mayor Stoess thanked former mayor Vivien Reinhart for planting flowers around Our Town. He recommended that residents help with her beautification efforts by regularly picking up trash and debris around the city.

OLD BUSINESS

Mr. Logsdon requested the Council's authorization of Mr. Craigmyle, Mayor Stoess and himself to pursue various solutions to providing police/security services to Our Town. There is \$80,000 in the current budget for police services. Discussion included police department enforcing ordinances and giving citations. Mr. Rowland brought up the issue of cost and what would we be getting extra beyond the police protection formerly provided by the Oldham County Police Department. Discussion also included whether personal services, like looking after property when an owner is out of town, would be desirable. Also, enforcement of weight limit

controls of trucks was discussed. The Council ultimately authorized Mr. Craigmyle, Mr. Logsdon and the Mayor to conduct a fact-finding study on police protection options.

NEW BUSINESS

Appointment: The Council voted unanimously to appoint Dorcas Merhoff to the Sidewalk Commission.

Tax Rate for 2003 and Collection:

Local property tax revenues account for approximately 2/3 of the annual budget for Our Town. The new rate suggested by the Oldham County Property Tax administrator is .1770. Accordingly, the Council had the first reading of the following: AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE TAX RATE FOR AD VALOREM TAXES ON ALL REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2003-2004 IN THE CITY OF PEWEE VALLEY, KENTUCKY, AND THE LEVY OF AN AD VALOREM TAX THEREON FOR THE GENERAL OPERATION PURPOSES OF THE CITY FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2003 TO JUNE 30, 2004. SECTION 5. The ad valorem and personal property tax rate for the fiscal year 2003-2004 is fixed at the rate of \$0.1770 dollars (17.70 cents) per hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation of property as assessed for taxation. Said tax shall be due as follows: October 31, 2003, face amount; after October 31, 2003, face amount plus six percent (6%) penalty plus interest thereon at the rate of one percent (1%) per month beginning November 1, 2003. All payments shall be remitted to the City of Pewee

Valley, P.O. Box 769, Pewee Valley, Kentucky 40056.

Discussion ensued as to whether the City should collect these taxes instead of the county sheriff's office. Mr. Rowland proposed that the ordinance be amended to provide that the City will collect the property taxes.

Collecting delinquent taxes was discussed. City Attorney Singler stated that the Mayor has the authority to make decisions on delinquent taxes. He recommended a separate ordinance on collecting delinquent taxes. The Mayor can decide whether to send out collection letters and then file a tax lien if taxes are still not paid.

Mr. Rowland moved to approve the first reading of the ordinance establishing the tax rate. He further moved that the date of the next Council meeting be changed from Monday, September 1 (Labor Day) to Tuesday, September 2, 2003, and that a public hearing on the tax rate increase be held at the beginning of the meeting. The Council voted unanimously in favor of the motion.

Mr. Arave noted that a number of trees around Our Town seem to be falling. City Attorney Singler stated that if a tree falls on a right of way, the City can remove it and require reimbursement of the costs of removal from the property owner. The City can also formally suggest that a property owner remove a damaged tree. The Council decided to ask the Tree Board to investigate and recommend a policy for recovery of costs of tree removal.

The Council approved payment of the monthly bills, with the exception of the bill

from Grasshoppers Landscaping and Tree Service Inc. for "trim back trees from street on Rebel Drive" in the amount of \$2000.00. This bill and the authorization of work will be investigated.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned upon unanimous vote of the Council members present.
