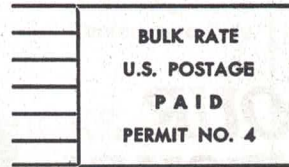

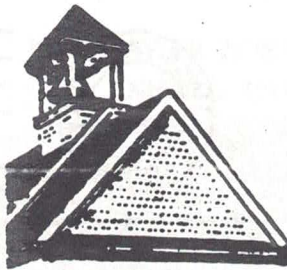

OUR TOWN

It's official - the City tax rate on real and personal property remains at 22 cents per \$100 valuation for the 1993-1994 fiscal year. An ordinance so stating was approved at a special City Council meeting on June 14.

The **P**et Station no longer is occupying the property owned by Bill Herdt at 219 LaGrange Road. The new tenant is Dixie Dry Cleaners, Inc.

The location next door to Beard's Grocery formerly occupied by Videoland is now leased by Aqua Ray, a division of Andrews Construction, Inc.; they feature pool kits, pool and patio supplies and accessories.

In response to a notice in our June issue, Pewees ordered 16 bumper stickers urging "Stop CSX Noise Pollution." Don Burchett of Anchorage offered the stickers, which he created, at 60 cents each, but then decided to donate them, so the money was returned to the purchasers.

DIEHARD REINHARDT?

Mayor Vivien H. Reinhardt has decided to run for her third term as Mayor.

Four of the six present City Council members are also expected to seek re-election - John Bishop, William Durham, Walter Hayes and Kathie Hodge. The other two, Ralph Beverly and Norman Turner, have indicated they will not. Anyone else interested?

The filing deadline for City offices is 4 p.m. Tuesday, August 3, at the County Clerk's office in LaGrange. That office can provide filing information.

All candidates will be on the ballot in November, and new terms will begin in January.

If you're not registered to vote in November, you may register in the County Clerk's office through Oct. 4.

State law requires registration books to be closed four weeks before (as well as one week after) an election. This year's general election will be on Tuesday, Nov. 2.

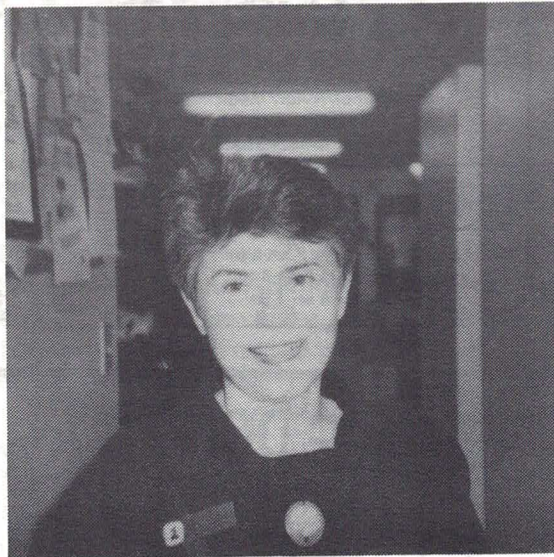
This month we want to introduce a new postal employee, Mark Bennett, and also take this opportunity to say thank you to Postmaster D.D. Hendrickson and her crew at the Pewee Valley Post Office for the fine job they consistently do. Always pleasant and courteous, they work efficiently as a team to get our mail in and out on time. Equally as important, they have kept alive our "small town" tradition of friendliness, and are never too busy to give directions to a lost delivery person or local information to a new resident.

The daily trip to the Pewee Valley Post Office was a time for socializing 50 years ago, and still is today a central place where residents enjoy swapping news with friends.

D. D. Hendrickson was sworn in as Postmaster on March 4, 1983 after former Postmaster Mackey Fletcher's retirement. A dedicated administrator, D. D. works long hours; she can be heard bustling behind the window long after closing time.

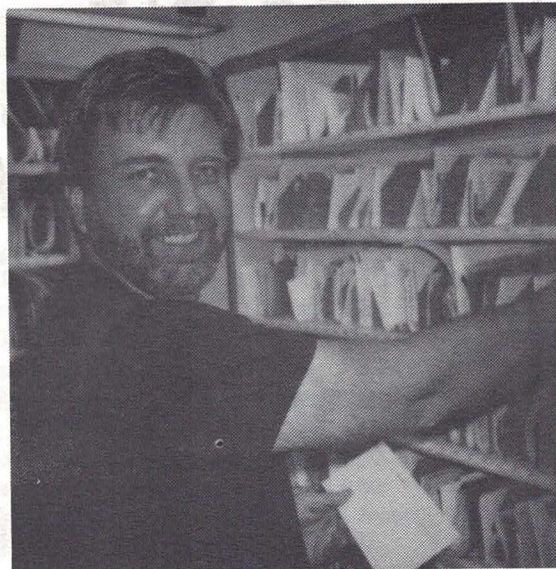
Linda Wilson and Angie Lantz, both part-time employees, are

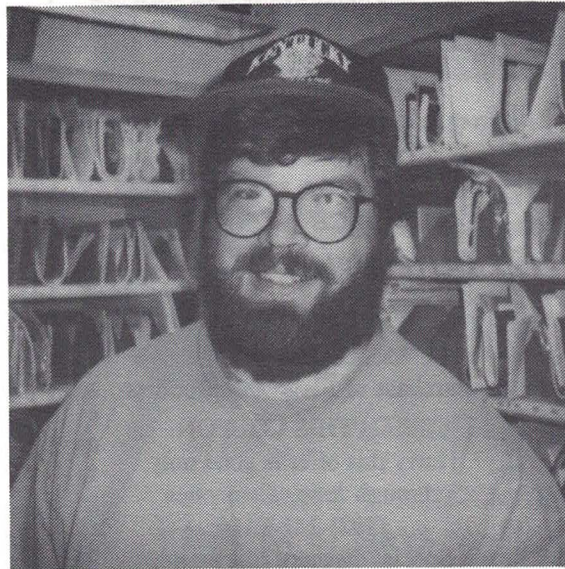

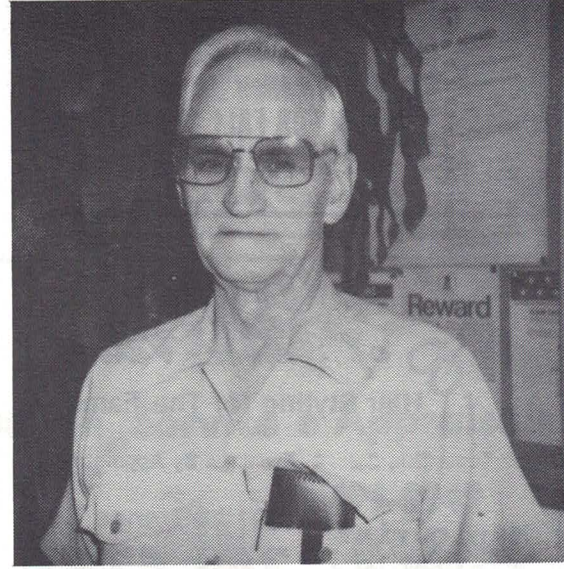
as he has done for the last 6 years. Mark Bennett is the recently hired rural carrier associate; he delivers the route every Saturday and at other times in Tony's absence. With

WHAT'S THE HURRY?

Among 73 citations issued to motorists by Pewee Valley police in June were 53 charging speeding. Most offenses occurred on LaGrange Road and Old Floydsburg Road.

Arrests during the month included 3 for speeding, 2 for operating on a suspended operator's license, and one each for DUI and reckless driving.

Additionally, motorists received 171 warnings, 147 of them for speeding.

A variety of runs were recorded in June, including 7 for accidents, 5 for loud music, 5 for suspicious persons, 2 for snakes in driveways and another for a snake in someone's kitchen, 4 for prowlers, 3 for domestic trouble, 4 for assists to EMS, and 11 for backing up Oldham County police.
