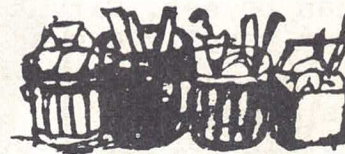

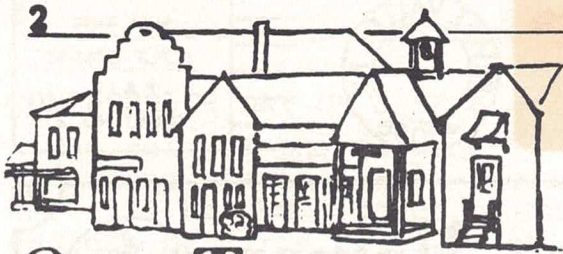

Our Town

Donald Biddle of Jefferson County has received a permit from the Oldham County Planning & Zoning Commission to build a three-bedroom residence at 7303 Shagbark Lane in Pewee Valley.

Also authorized is the construction of a 42x24-plus addition to the residence of Robert Miller at 304 Ash Ave.

Permits were issued for two deck additions on Maple Avenue—Robert Wynkoop at 117 and Zita Driskell at 317.

A swimming-pool permit was issued to Bert L. Fuqua, 200 Maple Ave.

Our Town's annual tax ordinance is pending in the City Council, awaiting receipt of assessment figures from the County Property Valuation Administrator's office. These are needed before a tax rate can be set. City tax bills go out usually around July 1.

The annual budget ordinance is scheduled to have first reading at the Council's next regular meeting June 1, with second reading and passage at a special meeting June 15.

THAT 9-1-1 CHARGE

You've probably noticed the extra charge now appearing on your phone bill to fund the Oldham County 9-1-1 emergency phone line.

This takes the place of the funds previously allocated by the various local governments—including ours—to pay for the 9-1-1 service. The change should be reflected in the City's upcoming fiscal-year budget.

Remember that you're paying for only our own county's emergency number. This is the only number you need to know to report an emergency to the police or fire department, or emergency medical services.

Your 9-1-1 call will go directly to the Oldham County Central Dispatch office which will relay the message immediately to the proper agency (such as, in our case, the Pewee Valley Police, Pewee Valley Fire District or South Oldham EMS).

We hope you won't need it—but if you ever do, don't ever forget. . .9-1-1.

Nine motorists were cited for speeding on Pewee Valley streets in April, according to Police Chief Larry Walls' monthly report.

Other charges: D. U. I. 3, reckless driving 2, no operator's license 2, and failure to dim headlights, one.

Four non-injury auto accidents were reported in April.

Roundup and cleanup time is here for Pewees.

Our Town's yearly Cleanup Day will be Saturday, May 16. This is the time to round up all the rubbish in your yard

(if your yard is so unfortunate as to be rubbish-laden) and take it to the dumpster awaiting you in the Old Town Square near the Fire Pit.

The dumpster will be available--to Pewees only--from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

The only unacceptable items are large appliances, such as ranges and refrigerators. And automobiles.

This annual Cleanup Day is sponsored by the City Council.

The dumpster will be furnished without cost, as in past years, by Waste Management of Kentucky, 7501 Grade Lane, Louisville.

Coming Up:

CONFEDERATE DAY ON JUNE 6. . .

The role of the Confederate chaplains during the Civil War will be the subject of an address by Eurie Hayes Smith, assistant commonwealth's attorney in Oldham County, when the annual Confederate Memorial Day ceremonies take place in Pewee Valley on Saturday, June 6.

Mr. Smith is himself chaplain of the John Hunt Morgan Camp of the Sons of Confederate Veterans, as well as an ordained minister of Dutch Reformed Church.

The program will begin at 4 p.m. in the Confederate Cemetery of Maple Avenue, just south of Old Floydsburg Road.

It's open to the public. If you'll need to sit down during the hour-long program, you're requested to bring a chair with you.

Co-sponsors are the City of Pewee Valley, Oldham County Historical Society, Sons of Confederate Veterans, Kentucky Society of the Military Order of Stars and Bars, the Louisville Civil War Roundtable and United Daughters of the Confederacy.

Samuel R. Flora of Lexington, commander of the Kentucky Division, Sons of Confederate Veterans, will preside.

Our Town's Mayor, Vivien H. Reinhardt, will welcome the visitors.

She will also provide flowers from her garden for local young ladies to strew among

the 313 Confederate graves at one point in the program. The flower-strewers are being recruited by Pewee Marty Todd.

Wreaths will be placed at the foot of the Confederate monument in the cemetery by various organizations.

The program is being arranged, as in several previous years, by Frank Rankin, Louisville, quartermaster general of the national Sons of Confederate Veterans organization and a past president of the Kentucky Historical Society.

At 5:30 p.m., following the cemetery program, a supper is to be served to visitors and local residents at the Pewee Valley Woman's Club.

This, like the program, is open to the public. However, for the supper, reservations are required — phone Frank Rankin at 451-2078 by June 1.
