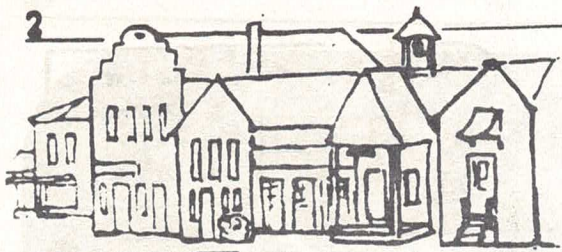

## Our Town

Three present City Councilmen—Norman Turner, Ralph E. Beverly and Harry Johns—have filed for re-election in November.

No one filed for the other three seats, but three Pewees have made known that they'll seek election by write-in votes ... Kathie Hodge, Bill Durnam, and John Bishop.

Norman is the old-timer of the bunch, in his 20th year at the job.

Tom Montgomery, John Falvey and Charles Dittmeier decided not to go for re-election.

Councilmen are elected for two-year terms. Mayor Vivien Reinhardt is completing her second year of a four-year term.

John Frith Stewart, former Mayor and now Our Town's legal counsel, celebrated his half-century birthday by attending the City Council session on Sept. 8.

The occasion was referred to as "nifty fifty" by Mayor Vivien Reinhardt, and Councilmen joined in on a "Happy Birthday" serenade.

A construction permit for another new house in Woodridge subdivision has been issued by the County Planning & Zoning Commission. It will be a four-bedroom residence at 7614 Woodridge Dr., erected by K & D Builders, company owned by Pewee Ken James that developed the subdivision.

In this year's Homearama, K & D won first and third in the favorite-home category as voted by persons who viewed the houses in Owl Creek.

And Stoess Manor Shop, featuring the decorating skills of Claudia Stoess, won the same honors in the voting on interior design.

The City has accepted a bid of \$600 maximum from Joseph A. Stuedle of Jeffersontown for auditing financial records for the fiscal year of 1986-87.

This will be his second year for the job. His firm has now, however, become a partnership under the name Stuedle, Mattingly & Company.

## POLICE NEWS

Watch out for those "foreign" motorists!

Pewee Valley police investigated six accidents in August — two involving injuries and four non-injury — and not one of the drivers was a Pewee.

Speeding was the greatest problem for our policemen in August, according to Chief Larry Walls' monthly report to City Councilmen.

Twenty-four motorists were cited for that offense, mostly on Ash Avenue and LaGrange Road.

Other highway offenses during August: Reckless driving, 3; driving with suspended license, 2; expired tags, 2; and driving under the influence, disregarding stop sign, and operator's license not in possession, one each.

Police are investigating a break-in on Aug. 11 at the Pewee Valley Baptist Temple. Nothing apparently was taken.

Thieves took the street sign at LaGrange Road and Wooldridge Avenue, but left the post — and the flower basket hanging on it — intact.

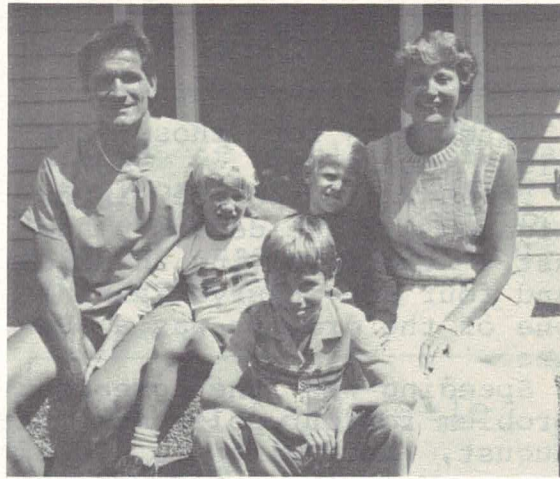
Nestled in the mountains of Virginia, Scott and Denise Clark actually sat down one evening with a map and decided to make a change, realizing they were "uprooting everything."

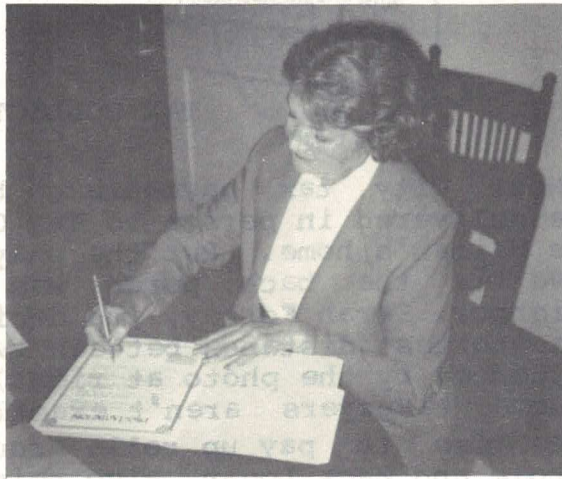

William J. Jansen, a Pewee Valley resident and retired district manager for the Otis Elevator Co., died Sept. 2 in Friendship Manor. He was 74.

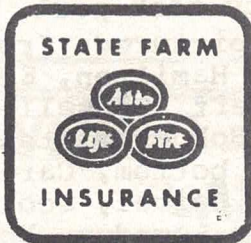
He is survived by his wife, Margaret, a daughter and a sister.

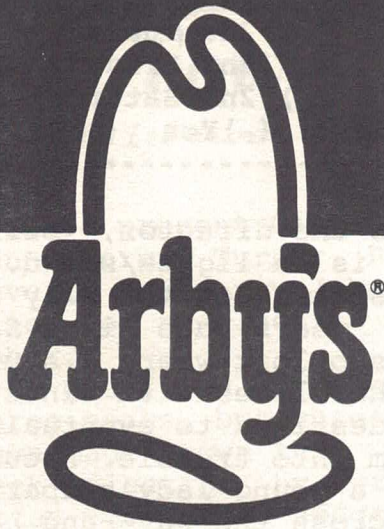

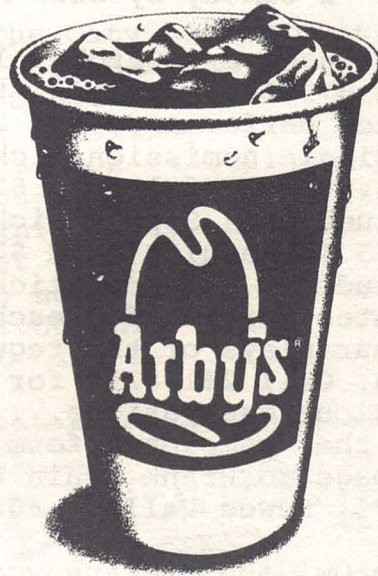
